Suggestions on how to use this document:

Suggestion 1: Ready-to-Print Quiz Booklet

- ★ Print pages 2 to 8 of this document.
- ★ Add your child's name to the space provided on the title page.
- ★ Staple all pages of your child's Quiz Booklet down the left hand side OR attach one staple to the top left hand corner of the booklet.
- **Present to class!** (Your child's teacher will assist with reading if needed).

Suggestion 2: Do-it-Yourself Quiz Booklet

- ★ Print page 2 of this document and add your child's name to the space provided.
- ★ Print 6 copies of page 9 (ie. the framed, blank booklet page ready for your child's illustrations).
- ★ Copy one set of Quiz Q&As on the bottom of each blank page....OR....cut and glue the typed Q&As directly from our ready-to-print Quiz Booklet.
- ★ Draw 1 matching picture per page....OR....Find, cut and glue 1 matching picture per page using suitable pictures from the Internet, magazines or your own photograph collection.
- ★ Staple all pages of your child's Quiz Booklet down the left hand side OR attach one staple to the top left hand corner of the booklet.
- **Present to class!** (Your child's teacher will assist with reading if needed).



Question: When a volcano erupts, yellow slime flows out. True or False?


Answer: False. Red hot lava flows from an erupting volcano.

Answer: True. Luckily we cannot feel it spinning.




Question: Earthquakes always cause lots of damage. True or False?
